IAA Conference & Trade Show Report

On October 18 & 19 over 600 members attended the IAA Annual Conference & Trade Show in Tinley Park. On Monday, October 17 we hosted EHAP classes while preparing for the big event. This year we offered split sessions for Commercial, Municipal, Utility, Demonstration Tree, and Spanish to provide a wide range of topics for our members.

New this year was the addition of electrical lines to the Demonstration Tree. Thanks to our new Utility Director Brian Sprinkle, we brought a utility hour to the demo tree and offered training on working around electrical lines. A big thanks to Ameren for sponsoring the material to build the electrical set up. We are talking about the possibility of making the wires live for next years show.

Also new this year, the exhibitors were invited up on Tuesday before the General Session to give the members a 30-second update to promote their company, sale or product.

For a second year, we partnered with the Illinois Forestry Association to offer a special session that was focused on Healthy Forests Along The Rural Urban Interface. This session participants heard from two leading experts: University of Illinois Extension Forester Chris Evans who focused on the impact of invasive plants on forested ecosystems in urban and rural settings. And Dr. Fredric Miller, Senior Research Scientist in Entomology at the Morton Arboretum, who looked at the history of forest pest impacts in other states and a predictor for what we might expect to see here in Illinois. These ses-

sions were so packed that people were standing outside the room looking in. Next year we will have host these sessions in a larger room.

Session topics covered but not limited to information about Insurance Coverage, Working with Generational Diversity, Crane Use, Long Distant Drones, Pruning, Why do Trees Die, Societal Trends Impacting Private and Public Sector to Zika and Lyme Disease. We had a lot of good feedback on the wide range of topics to meet all of our members needs.

Special Recognition Award: April Toney April Toney has been the Executive Director of the Illinois Arborist Association for over 16 years, and during that time has made it one of the most successful and widely recognized chapters in the country, as well as internationally. This past year, the decision was made to change our Advanced Training Program over to an Advanced Qualification Program. This comes with many benefits, and was at the time perceived to be a relatively easy transition. However, after many of the adjustments were already made, and classes had been scheduled, it was discovered that there were an intimidating number of things, which had to be done to make the transition complete from a legal standpoint. This included creating a peer review system for teachers and domains, creating a Policies and Procedures manual for the Qualification program and many other administrative tasks, which could not be delegated to committees in a timely manner. The easy thing to do would have been to just give up and revert the program back to what it was. But April, undaunted as usual, went through the painstaking process of drafting the documents. scheduling the conference calls, herding all of the cats, and getting everything put together so that our program could continue to grow. For this reason, we would like to nominate April Toney for special recognition, for saving the Advanced Qualification Program with an overwhelming effort on her part.

Special Recognition Award: Nate Paulsberg Nate's input was invaluable at our first Aerial Rescue class, regarding patient packaging, positioning on the ground and what an arborist can do medical-wise while waiting for the EMT's to arrive. 



Are You A Certified Arborist?

Benefits of Certification


Certification builds an individual's self-image. By studying for and passing the exam, individuals reaffirm to themselves and their peers a thorough knowledge and dedication to arboriculture.

Certification affords the public and those in government the opportunity to make an informed selection of services based on the knowledge and advanced training demonstrated by an ISA Certification.

- The process of becoming ISA Certified and maintaining the designation provides incentives to the individual to continue his or her ongoing professional development.
- Certification is a tool to help employers in both training their personnel and selecting new employees.
- Holding an ISA credential can lead to an increase in income and promote new opportunities in professional advancement.
- Certification is a tool used to set oneself apart from the competition and gain a competitive edge in today's economy.
- Certifications, sometime more than price, can be a deciding factor when multiple individuals bid for the same job. If you want the job done right, hire the right people!

Participant Eligibility Requirements

The ISA Certification Board requires a candidate to have a minimum of three years of full-time experience in arboriculture. Acceptable experience includes the practical use of knowledge involved in pruning, fertilization, installation and establishment, diagnosis and treatment of tree problems, cabling and bracing, climbing, or other services that directly relate to arboriculture. Examples of experience sources include, but are not limited to:



- Tree care companies
- Nurseries
- Landscape companies
- Municipalities
- State forestry agencies
- Utility companies
- Academic arboriculture/horticulture departments (for instructors)
- Horticulture/extension programs (for advisors)
- Consultancies
- Pest control providers (for advisors and applicators)

Applicable volunteer work may count towards eligibility if it is supervised and documentation can be supplied.

The eligibility requirement may also be satisfied with a two-year degree in arboriculture and two years of practical experience or a four-year degree in a related field and one year of practical experience. Multiple degrees cannot be utilized to equal degree requirements for a longer program.

If you are self-employed or own your own company, you will be required to submit three

letters of reference with your application. References may be in the form of copies of invoices, contracts, and/or business licenses. Please contact ISA for other possible forms of verification.

By submitting your application, you authorize ISA to contact the practical experience reference(s) named on your application to substantiate your eligibility.
